Over the course of this year, we have focused our efforts on building our capacity for greater outreach. OUR PILLARS: TREATMENT

STAR Institute stands as a leading authority in sensory integration and processing. In 2022, we persevered in delivering evidence-based, client-centered care, ensuring the continued provision of essential services for individuals of all ages. Our unwavering commitment propelled us to overcome challenges, allowing us to offer comprehensive support from diagnosis to successful intervention.

Within our treatment center, we offer a wide array of services, including occupational therapy, speech therapy, mental health services, pediatrician-led multidisciplinary evaluations, specialized feeding therapy, a School Readiness therapeutic classroom, groups, and services tailored to adults and adolescents. The STAR treatment team addresses various aspects such as regulation, relationships, community engagement, mental health, feeding and eating, academic/vocational success, communication, and language development throughout the lifespan.

Acknowledging the significant impact of sensory processing differences, we specialize in supporting conditions such as autism, ADHD, neurodevelopmental differences, trauma, learning variations, and various mental health conditions.

- Our treatment team participated in four community events, including the Macaroni Kids Kids Fair, Autism Community Store Resource Fair, PASCO's Annual Picnic, and ACECC. During these gatherings, we engaged in discussions about sensory processing challenges and showcased the services offered at our treatment center.
- Incorporating the STAR frame of reference, our center organized 10 therapeutic programs and camps, prioritizing sensory-regulation and relationship dynamics for a holistic approach to well-being.
- STAR introduced autism services, providing secure sensory exploration and a collaborative team approach with strengths-based therapy, self-advocacy education, and relational health support for individuals on the spectrum.
- Our Feeding Team's success involved consulting and co-treating with ERC, running a highly effective Snack and Play group that garnered positive parent feedback, and successfully collecting valuable research data.

CLINICAL DIRECTOR

Mim Ochsenbein, STAR's former Director of Education, transitioned into the role of Clinical Director. Mim has significantly shaped and evolved our education program, responding to the needs of the field and community. Mim's expertise as a licensed occupational therapist and her background in social work make her an ideal leader for our therapy and treatment team.



To say that we saw immediate results is an understatement. Within the first few sessions at STAR, it felt like we were finally able to meet our son. All of the sudden a light turned on. He had a personality! He started pushing himself physically. He started playing with us! He began communicating so well, and even using his imagination. To see my son laugh, play, ask for help, problem--solve, to see him persevere when it's a little bit hard, was like the answer to a million prayers.

OUR PILLARS: EDUCATION

The mission of STAR's Education Department is to actively contribute to the elevation of global awareness surrounding the pivotal role of sensory health and well-being. With a dedicated commitment, we strive to empower professionals, families, and individuals impacted by disordered sensory processing by offering comprehensive and up-to-date information based on research and best practices. Through our efforts, we aim to foster a deeper understanding of sensory integration/progressing and health and its significance in enhancing overall well-being, thereby positively impacting communities worldwide.



Community Workshop

STAR hosted a virtual community workshop with our clinical team, engaging in a 3-part, open-forum discussion on daily challenges in the sensory community. Participants, including parents, individuals with sensory differences, and professionals, explored specific topics each day, contributing to our understanding of sensory health and addressing common day-to-day challenges.



Virtual Summit: Sensory Health in Autism

We hosted our third annual Virtual Summit: Sensory Health in Autism, uniting speakers from academia, clinical practice, and advocacy. The event drew 350 attendees, fostering exploration into the extensive impact of disordered sensory processing on the Autistic experience.



Annual Symposium

Our 2022 STAR Symposium marks our return to in-person events post-COVID, centering on the significance of Sensory Health and Wellness. This event explores the profound impact on physical, emotional, and mental health throughout the lifespan. Speakers this year delved into the relevance and power of sensory health, addressing its influence from early interactions and attachment development to adulthood.



Virtual Summit: Sensory Health in Schools

STAR's second virtual summit, which attracted over 200 participants, focused on sensory health in school environments, highlighting its significant impact on the broader community. This multi-day event provided valuable insights into the crucial role of active awareness and the implementation of sensory health practices within educational settings.

OUR PILLARS: RESEARCH

The research team at STAR Institute conducts and collaborates in rigorous research into the identification, characterization, and treatment of sensory integration/processing strengths and needs. Research allows for the development of more targeted interventions and the refinement of existing interventions, as well as impacting the content of our educational programs. The overarching goal is to enhance sensory health, wellness and quality of life for children and adults and their families.

2021 RESEARCH PROJECT WRAP UP

Feeding Research into the Effectiveness of the STAR SOS Approach

For feeding research, we needed to identify sensitive outcome measures that would reflect the changes we see in therapy. Videos give us actual objective performance rather the parent reports and home videos give us carryover and generalization to real life.

Research on Adults with SPD Characterizing Individuals Who Seek Intervention

This year we published on the adult experience in therapy. We are also examining interoception and how adults and adolescents self-report interoceptive strengths and challenges.

Here is what we are hoping to explore or learn from these studies or why these studies are critical to the advancement of sensory integration and processing.

 Research and first-person testimonials support the fact that children on the autism spectrum have a higher degree of anxiety, which is further exacerbated by being non-speaking. However, despite these widely appreciated facts, We earned an \$88,000 grant from The Brain Foundation to study the Bio-Behavioral Study of Arousal in non-speaking or minimally speaking autistic children.



there is limited guidance, and only a small research base informing therapeutic supports for this population. Indeed non-speaking children's autonomy is further limited by clinical supports that are overly simplistic and fail to accommodate significant arousal and motor differences that hamper the development of cognitive and emotional capacities. Can we identify physiological and behavioral toxic stress patterns in non-speaking autistic children and do these patterns change during treatment? This study will inform a more targeted approach to the treatment of non-speaking autistic children, by characterizing stress patterns, testing a novel intervention, and integrating the use of wearable technology.

- There is an increasing number of adults and adolescents with sensory processing differences impacting daily life. As a leader in the field, STAR Institute is one of the few clinics where adults/adolescents can receive services. Our goal is to characterize individuals seeking support and to provide evidence of the effectiveness of our intervention.
- Feeding research is needed to provide evidence of the effectiveness of programs that support children who are problem eaters. STAR's program is unique in that it integrates the SOS Approach with the STAR Frame of Reference.
- Collaboration is the hallmark of research. Looking at physiological and behavioral measures of arousal in collaboration with Dr Connie Lillas.
- Studying the impact of mentorship training on knowledge development and professional growth with the OT pediatric community in collaboration with Dr. Bryan Gee of Rocky Mountain University of Health Professions.



STAR Institute commits its resources to treatment, education, and research opportunities in order to help millions of people whose lives are impacted by sensory processing challenges every day.


Revenue
